

Non-Fiction:

The Watchmaker's Daughter by Larry Loftus – This is a well-written, informative, inspirational biography of Corrie ten Boom and her family. It is thoroughly researched and vividly describes the horrors, heartbreak and deprivation suffered by Corrie ten Boom during World War II. Her faith, hope, forgiveness, and good works are truly uplifting. There are many added details and photos that are not contained in Corrie's previous biography "The Hiding Place".

Angels by David Jeremiah – The author provides readers with a scripturally based, clearly written discussion of angels and their roles in the Christian life. Throughout the book, Jeremiah does an excellent job dispelling secular and religious myths and misconceptions through Biblical documentation. He also references revered Christian scholars that adds credibility to his clearly presented viewpoints. Recommended to anyone who wants to learn about angels from a reliable source.

God's Smuggler by Brother Andrew – This is a classic missionary biography that chronicles the life of Brother Andrew, the founder of the Open Doors charity, which supports persecuted Christians worldwide. The narrative follows Andrew from his adventurous childhood, where he dreamt of becoming a spy and engaged in acts of sabotage against the Nazis, to his wartime experiences as a soldier where he sustained a serious injury. After his miraculous healing, Andrew embraced a life of faith and missionary work, venturing into communist smuggle Bibles countries to and support underground Christian communities. A beautiful story of one man's perseverance and faith in the Lord.

Fiction:

The Bookshop of Secrets by Mollie Rushmeyer – This is a mystery story with romantic elements featuring a broken young woman searching for clues to her family's legacy in missing old first edition books. The main character Hope has a tragic upbringing and her love interest Ronan, is burdened with a family curse. Yet they come together and continually prove to each other that they are more than their pasts. The mystery of the missing books and the search for lost treasure is intricately woven into the story with plenty of twists and surprises.

When Silence Sings by Sarah Loudin Thomas – A beautifully written novel set in a small Appalachian town in 1930. Two families, the McLeans and the Harpes have been feuding with each other for generations. Things come to a head quickly after a McLean murders a Harpe in cold blood and disappears. Within the Harpe family is a godly man with a message from God to share the gospel with his sworn enemy. Like Jonah, he objects and runs away, but God has other plans! The story reminds us to look at the heart of a person and not just on

his or her actions.

The Prodigal by Brennan Manning – In "The Prodigal" we meet Jack Chisholm who is the founder of a mega church. He has become a successful TV pastor and author, reaching the lives of others. However, his values begin to change and when a night out turns into a PR nightmare, his church fires him as their pastor and his family are whisked away under the church's hidden protection. Life has hit rock bottom for Jack and soon he turns to the bottle. Enter his father who with arms wide open takes him back to his hometown. Jack is about to rediscover what it means to be part of a community and why he embraced missions and preaching the word of Christ. A modern twist on the story of The Prodigal Son.
